Learning Outcomes

- Students will distinguish between countable and uncountable nouns, identifying their characteristics and appropriate quantifiers (e.g., "many" for countable and "much" for uncountable).
- Students will apply countable and uncountable nouns accurately in sentences, demonstrating proper grammar and vocabulary in various contexts.

Countable Nouns

Nouns that we can count by using numbers are called countable nouns.

Look at the pictures and read the following words.







two toys

three mangoes

four rabbits















five pens

three ducks

We can count the above things by using numbers like two toys, three mangoes, four rabbits, three kites, five pens and three ducks.

So, these nouns are countable nouns.



Countable nouns have both singular and plural forms.

Uncountable Nouns

We cannot count some things in number.

Uncountable nouns can only be spoken of in singular number.










Write 'C' for countable nouns and 'UC' for uncountable nouns.


















































- Nouns we can count by using number are called countable nouns.
