Look at this picture. Frame four sentences about it.




Read the following groups of words.

No, these groups of words do not make any sense. We cannot call them sentences. Let us put the above groups of words in a proper order.

1. An orange is a fruit.
2. The orange is juicy.
3. Rupa loves to eat orange.

Now, these groups of words make sense. So, we can call these groups of words sentences.




