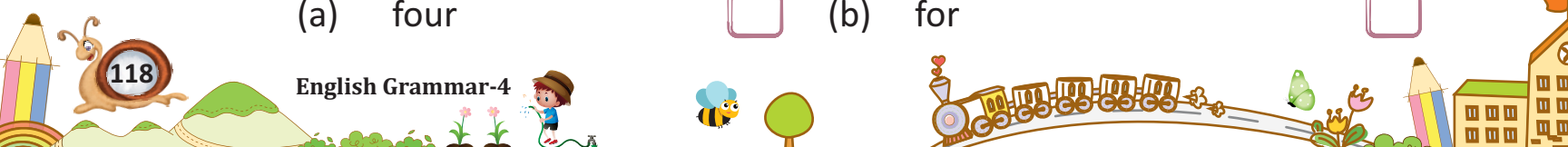
Homophones
