


Countable and **Uncountable Nouns**

Learning Outcomes

- They will learn when to use "many" or "much."



Countable Nouns

Nouns which can be counted are known as Countable Nouns.

Examples: book, apple, pen, boy, girl, etc.

Look at the pictures and read the words given below each pictures.



five girls



three pens



six flowers













We can count girls, pens and flowers.

We can also count kites, oranges and rabbits.

Girls, pens, flowers, kites, oranges and rabbits are Countable Nouns.
