Countable Nouns

Nouns which can be counted are known as **Countable Nouns**.

Examples : book, apple, pen, boy, girl, etc.

five girls



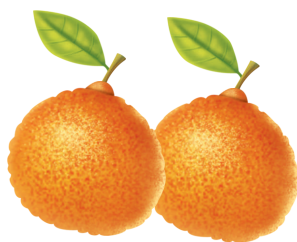
three pens

We can count girls, pens and flowers.

We can also count kites, oranges and rabbits.

Girls, pens, flowers, kites, oranges and rabbits are **Countable Nouns**.
