

Nouns: Number

Learning Outcomes

- Students will identify singular and plural nouns.
- They will understand the rules for making nouns plural.

Singular and Plural

A noun that is used for one person, place or thing is called a **Singular Noun**.

Examples: boy, girl, book, pen, kite, potato, etc.

A noun that is used for more than one person, place or thing is called a **Plural Noun**.

Examples: boys, girls, books, pens, kites, potatoes, etc.

Read the following sentences.

- 1. The girl reads a book.
- 2. The girls read books.

In the first sentence, the nouns girl and book stand for only one girl and one book. The nouns girl and book are in the singular number. Singular means one.

In the second sentence, the nouns girls and books stand for more than one girl and more than one book.

So the nouns girls and books are in plural number.









• Plural means more than one.

Formation of Plural

1. We add -s to most of the nouns to form plural.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
lion	lions	tiger	tigers
kite	kites	balloon	balloons
cat	cats	dog	dogs
bat	bats	ball	balls
book	books	pen	pens
finger	fingers	hand	hands
monk	monks	state	states
house	houses	horse	horses
game	games	shoe	shoes
tree	trees	kite	kites

2. Nouns that end in a hissing sound i.e. s, ss, sh, ch, and es form their plural by adding -es.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
fox	foxes	match	matches
brush	brushes	watch	watches
glass	glasses	grass	grasses
bus	buses	bunch	bunches
branch	branches	kiss	kiss <mark>es</mark>
bench	benches	dress	dresses
torch	torches	bush	bushes
class	classes	gas	gases
patch	patches	box	boxes
ash	ashes	dish	dishes
inch	inches	church	churches









3. Nouns that end in for fe usually form their plurals by changing for fe into ves.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
self	selves	calf	calves
knife	kniv <mark>es</mark>	wolf	wolves
leaf	leaves	shelf	shelves
loaf	loaves	thief	thieves

Exception:roof-roofs

4. Nouns that end in o form their plural by adding -es to singular.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
buffalo	buffalo <u>es</u>	hero	heroes
cargo	cargoes	echo	echoes
tomato	tomatoes	volcano	volcanoes
potato	potatoes	hero	heroes

Exception: photo – photos

5. Nouns that end in consonant +y form their plural by changing the y to ies.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
country	countries	lady	ladies
city	cities	сору	copi <mark>es</mark>
cry	cries	duty	duties
fly	flies	army	armi <mark>es</mark>
story	stories	country	countries
baby	babies	diary	diaries
lily	lilies	fly	flies
story	stories	reply	repli <mark>es</mark>
family	families	sky	ski <mark>es</mark>

6. Nouns ending in vowel +y form their plural just by adding -s to the singular.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
donkey	donkey <mark>s</mark>	chimney	chimneys
boy	boys	ray	ray <mark>s</mark>
toy	toys	monkey	monkey <mark>s</mark>
valley	valley <mark>s</mark>	day	day <mark>s</mark>
joy	joy <mark>s</mark>	key	keys









7. Some nouns do not follow any of the rules mentioned above.

Singular	Plurals	Singular	Plural
OX	oxen	deer	deer
mouse	mice	foot	feet
tooth	teeth	woman	women
man	men	sheep	sheep


