


Nouns: Gender

Learning Outcomes

- Students will learn the two genders of nouns.
- They will identify masculine and feminine nouns.

Masculine and Feminine Gender

A noun that refers to a male is said to be of the **Masculine Gender**.

Examples: man, uncle, nephew, etc.

A noun that refers to female is said to be of the Feminine Gender.

Examples: woman, aunt, niece, etc.

Read the following sentence.

- 1. Amresh is a boy. He is my brother.
- 2. Amrita is a girl. She is my sister.

In the above sentences, boy and brother are the names of males.

Girl and sister are the names of females. Boy and brother are said to be of the Masculine Gender.

Girl and sister are said to be of the **Feminine Gender**.

Common Gender

A noun that refers to both male and female is said to be of the Common Gender.

Examples: doctor, teacher, student, friend, etc.

Read the following sentences.

- 1. Mr. Chaudhary is a doctor.
- 2. Mrs. Chaudhary is a doctor too.

The word doctor can stand both for Mr. and Mrs. Chaudhary.

So, the word doctor can be used for both male and female. Therefore, doctor is said to be of the **Common Gender**.


Neuter Gender

A noun that refers to a non-living thing is said to be of the Neuter Gender.

Examples: book, pen, ball, bat, etc.

Read the following sentences.

- 1. Mona has a doll.
- 2. Sipun has a kite.





















• The nouns which may be used for male and female are said to be of the **Common Gender**, e.g., teacher, friend. The word 'teacher' or 'friend' may mean either a male teacher / friend or a female teacher / friend. It is common to both boys and girls. So, words like teacher, friend, pupil, child are said to be nouns in the common gender.

List of Masculine and Feminine Gender

There are three ways in which a masculine noun can be changed into a feminine noun:

1. By using different word:

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
son	daughter	husband	wife
father	mother	brother	sister
boy	girl	man	woman
sir	madam	nephew	niece
uncle	aunt	king	queen

2. By changing small words in case of compound words:

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
gentleman	gentlewoman	stepfather	stepmother
grandfather	grandmother	peacock	peahen

3. By adding 'ess' to the masculine:

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
lion	lioness	shepherd	shepherdess
jew	jewess	host	hostess
poet	poetess	peer	peeress
master	mistress	hunter	huntress
priest	priestess	god	goddess
actor	actress	count	countess


