Simple Present Tense

Formation of Simple Present Tense

1. With first person, second person and third person plural subjects (I, we, you, they and all plural subjects), we use the root form of the verb.

I read; we eat; you run; they jump







2. With third person singular subjects (he, she, it and all other singular subjects), we add -s or -es to the root form of the verb.

He reads; she eats; Neha runs; it jumps

Use of Simple Present Tense___

We use **simple present tense**:

• To describe a repeated or habitual action of persons or characteristic of things.

Examples:

- 1. He takes a nap in the afternoon.
- 2. Igo for a walk every morning.
- 3. I wash my face when I wake up.
 - To express general truths.

Examples:

- 1. Water boils at 100° celsius.
- 2. The Earth moves round the Sun.
