### **Present Perfect Tense**

The present perfect tense is used to talk about an action completed in the recent past whose effect continues in the present.

### Read the following sentences.

- 1. I have eaten my meal.
- We have reached the station. 2.
- 3. She has won the first prize.

The verbs in these sentences are in the **present perfect tense**.

### Formation of the Present Perfect Tense

We use has/have + past participle form of the verb. 1.

**Example:** Has bought; Have passed; Has left



We often use words like already and just with the present perfect tense.















A verb has three main forms: present, past and past participle.

### For example,

Preset	Past	Past participle
play	played	played
pass	passed	passed

To form a sentence in present perfect tense we need the past participle form of a verb. So, it is important to know how to form past participle form of a verb.

### 1. Formation of the Past and Past Participle Forms

Present	Past	Past participle
1. In most cases		Add-ed
paint	paint <b>ed</b>	paint <b>ed</b>
watch	watch <mark>ed</mark>	watched

Some other verbs of this kind are: play, work, call, walk, clean, etc.

# Most words ending in a hissing sound add -ed (s, ss, ch, sh, x, z)

ru <b>sh</b>	rush <mark>ed</mark>	rush <mark>ed</mark>
wat <b>ch</b>	watched	watch <mark>ed</mark>

Some other verbs of this kind are: kiss, wash, search.

### 3. Most words ending in -e, -ee, ie

Δ	Ы	Ы	-ed

care	car <mark>ed</mark>	car <mark>ed</mark>
agree	agree <mark>d</mark>	agree <mark>d</mark>
bake	bak <mark>ed</mark>	bake <mark>d</mark>

Some other verbs of this kind are: like divide, live, race, hate, etc.

### 4. Consonant + y ... ye -ied

fry	fr <b>ied</b>	fr <mark>ied</mark>
app <mark>ly</mark>	appl <mark>ied</mark>	appl <mark>ied</mark>
try	tr <b>ied</b>	tr <b>ied</b>

Some other verbs of this kind are: hurry, cry, reply, etc.
