### , Simple Past Tense

We use the simple past tense to indicate an action that took place in the past and is over now.

**Example:** My father **left** for Delhi yesterday.

#### Read the following sentences.

- 3. They went to Delhi last week.






In the above sentences, the verbs played, visited and went are in the **simple past** tense.

We use the simple past tense form of the verb.
play - played visit - visited, go - went









Use of the Simple Past Tense

The simple past tense is used to express.

• an action completed in the past

#### **Examples:**

- We waited you for three hours. 1.
- Mother cooked food for us. 2.
- past habits

#### **Examples:**

- 1. My grandfather played badminton with me.
- 2. I went to visit my grandparents every summer.
