Active and Passive Voice

Read the following sentences.



In the above sentence, Nisha is the **doer of the action** or **subject**, plays is the **action** or **verb** and badminton is the **receiver of the action** or **object**.

When the subject of the verb is the doer of the action or acts or is active, the sentence is said to be in **Active voice**.









Now read the following sentence.



In this sentence, badminton does not perform the action of playing instead, it receives the action.

When the subject of the verb is the receiver of an action or is acted upon or is passive, the sentence is said to be in the **Passive voice**.

Some More Examples of Active and Passive Voice

- Neha solved the sum. (Active)
- The sum was solved by Neha. (Passive)

This sentence is about the sum, and says what happened to it.

The first sentence is said to be in the active voice and the second sentence is said to be in the passive voice.

So, this sentence is in the passive voice.

Grammar Byte

- The subject and object are interchanged. The subject of the active voice becomes the object of the passive voice and the object of the active voice becomes the subject of the passive voice.
- A correct form of the verb be is used followed by the past participle form of the verb.









Rules for Changing the Pronouns

If the subject or the object in an active voice sentence is a pronoun changes are made as follow.

I – me he – him
We – us she – her
You – you they – them
it – it

Let us carefully observe the variations of tenses in the Active and Passive sentences.

Simple Present Tense

- We eat rice. (Active)
 Rice is eaten by us. (Passive)
- The girls draw pictures. (Active)
 Pictures are drawn by the girls. (Passive)



In simple present tense:

Active voice: the root form of the verb (s/es)

Passive voice: is/are/am + past participle form of the verb

Active voice: past tense of the verb

Passive voice: was/were + past participle form of the verb



Simple Future Tense


1. Mamta will eat an apple.

An apple will be eaten by Mamta.













In simple Future tense:

Active voice: will/shall + root form of the verb

Passive voice: will/shall + be + past participle form of the verb

Points to Remember

- When the subject of the verb is the doer of the action or acts or is active the sentence is said to be in **Active Voice**.
- When the subject of the verb is the receiver of an action or is acted upon or is passive, the sentence is said to be in **Passive Voice**.
- The subject and object are interchanged while changing an **Active Voice** sentence into **Passive Voice**.
- A correct form of the verb be is used followed by the past participle form of the verb.
- The preposition **by** is used before the object.
