Nouns : Gender

We can classify nouns on the basis of gender.

There are four kinds of gender.

- 1. Masculine gender
- 3. Common gender

1. Masculine Gender

Nouns that refer to males are said to be in masculine gender.

Example: son, father, prince, uncle, etc.

- 2. Feminine gender
- 4. Neuter gender

2. Feminine Gender

Nouns that refer to females are said to be in feminine gender.

Example: daughter, mother, princess, aunt,









3. Common Gender

Nouns that can be used for both male and female are known as common gender.

Example: singer, friend, doctor, cousin, etc.

4. Neuter Gender

Nouns that refer to non-living things are known as **neuter gender**.

Examples: book, chalk, box, soap, etc.

Formation of Feminine Gender

Feminine gender of nouns can be formed by following the rules given below.

1. By adding -ess to the masculine.

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
lion	lioness	author	authoress
poet	poetess	baron	baroness

2. By adding -ess after altering the spelling slightly.

Masculine	Feminine	Masculine	Feminine
emperor	empress	tiger	tigress

3. By placing a word used before or after.

4. By using an entirely different word.
