Get ready to explore the world of names! Look closely at this colourful picture of a busy railway station.

- "The train is ready to leave the platform". (What is the name of the thing? Train!)
- "Passengers are waiting with their luggage". (What is the name of the people? Passengers!)
- "The chai seller is pouring tea". (What is the name of the person? Chai seller!)

These naming words such as train, passengers, chai seller are called nouns. They name people, places, animals, and things in our sentences.



What Is a Noun?

A Noun is the Name of a Person, Place, Thing, Animal, or Idea. It helps us talk about everything around or inside us.

Examples:

• People: teacher, Neha, uncle

• Places: school, Agra, park

• Things: book, pencil, phone

• Animals: dog, elephant, peacock


• Ideas/Feelings: freedom, happiness, kindness

Kinds of Nouns

Nouns come in many types, just like candies in a sweet shop!

1. Proper Nouns - Special Names

They name particular people, places, or things and always begin with a capital letter.

Examples: Rohan, Delhi, Monday, Ganga River, Diwali

2. Common Nouns - General Names

They name ordinary people, places, or things.

Examples: girl, city, day, mountain, festival

3. Collective Nouns - Group Names

They name a group of people, animals, or things seen as one unit.

Examples: a team of players, a bunch of bananas, a herd of cows

4. Abstract Nouns - Names of Ideas & Feelings

They name things we cannot touch like feelings, qualities, or ideas.

Examples: bravery, love, honesty, childhood, truth

5. Material Nouns - Substance Names

They name materials or substances used to make other things.

Examples: gold, wood, water, cotton, iron







Countable vs Uncountable Nouns

Some Nouns you can count, others you cannot.

Countable Nouns

- Can be counted
- Have singular and plural forms
- Use a/an, many, few, several, two, etc.

Examples: apple/apples, book/books, child/children

- I have three pens.
- · A cat is sleeping.

Uncountable Nouns

- Cannot be counted individually
- Have only one form (no plural)
- Use some, much, little, a lot of, etc.
- Don't use a/an before them

Examples: milk, sugar, information, advice, water, music

Please give me some water.



• I need a water.





"Many Nouns that are Uncountable in English may be Countable in other languages so watch out"!
