

What is an Adjective?

An Adjective is a word that describes or modifies a Noun or Pronoun.

Example:

The **Tall** man entered the **noisy** room with a **Blue** bag.

("tall", "noisy", and "blue" describe the nouns.)

Types of Adjectives

There are 6 key types of Adjectives:

1. Adjective of Quality

Describes the kind or nature.

Example: kind girl, tall building, rough road

2. Adjective of Quantity

Tells how much of something.

Example: some water, little effort, enough money

3. Adjective of Number

Tells how many or in what order.

Example: five apples, first prize, several students

4. Demonstrative Adjective

Points out which one(s).

Example: this book, those stars, that house

5. Interrogative Adjective

Used with Nouns to ask questions.

Example: Which book? What movie? Whose phone?

6. Possessive Adjective

Shows ownership.

Example: my pen, your shoes, their house

Degrees of Comparison

Adjectives can **compare** people or things.

Degree	Example
Positive	Ria is tall.
Comparative.	Siya is taller than Ria.
Superlative	Meera is the tallest of all.















GRAMMAR BYTE

- Add -er / -est for short words: tall → taller → tallest
- Use more / most for long words: beautiful → more beautiful → most beautiful

Order of Adjectives

When we use many Adjectives, there's a natural order to follow:

Opinion \rightarrow Size \rightarrow Age \rightarrow Shape \rightarrow Colour \rightarrow Origin \rightarrow Material \rightarrow Purpose + Noun

Example:

• A beautiful small old round golden Indian wooden cooking pot.

Adjective vs Adverb Confusion

Sometimes, we mix up Adjectives and Adverbs. Here's the key difference:

Part of Speech	Describes	Example
Adjective	Noun	She is a quick runner.
Adverb	Verb/Adj	She runs quickly .






