Direct Speech: "I love chocolates", said Meera.

Indirect Speech: Meera said that she loved chocolates.

Did you notice?

In Direct Speech, we use Quotation Marks.

In Indirect Speech, we remove quotes and adjust the sentence!



What is Direct and Indirect Speech?

Reported speech is how we represent the speech of other people or what we ourselves say.

There are two main types of Reported Speech: **Direct speech** and **Indirect speech**.

- **Direct speech** repeats the exact words the person used, or how we remember their words: For Example: Barbara said, "I didn't realise it was midnight."
- In indirect speech, the original speaker's words are changed.

For Example: Barbara said she had n't realised it was midnight.

In this example, I becomes she and the verb tense reflects the fact that time has passed since the words were spoken: didn't realise becomes hadn't realised.

Speech Type	Description	Example
Direct Speech	The exact words of the speaker	She said, "I am ready".
Indirect Speech	Reported version of what was said	She said that she was ready.

Rules of Changing Speech:-

Basic Rules:

- 1. Remove quotation marks
- 2. Use a reporting verb (said, told, asked, etc.)
- 3. Change the tense, pronouns, and time words
- 4. Use 'that', 'if', or 'to' as connectors

Reporting Verbs and Connectors:-

Reporting Verb	Use With	Example
said / told	statements	She said that / He told me that
asked / inquired	questions	He asked if
ordered / requested / advised	commands	She ordered me to

Changes in Tenses

Tense Shift Chart (when reporting verb is in past tense):

Direct Speech	Indirect Speech	
Present Simple	Past Simple	
Present Continuous	Past Continuous	
Present Perfect	Past Perfect	
Past Simple	Past Perfect	
Will/Shall	Would/Should	
Can/May	Could/Might	

No tense change if the reporting verb is in present/future tense.

Change of Pronouns and Time Words

Pronouns change according to the **subject and object**:

She said, "I love my dog".

She said that **she** loved **her** dog.

Time/Place Word Changes:

Direct Speech	Indirect Speech
today	that day
tomorrow	the next day
yesterday	the previous day
now	then
here	there
this	that
these	those

Changing Interrogative Sentences

Rules:

- Use **if/whether** for Yes-No questions.
- Use the question word (who, what, where...) if it exists.
- Change the question into **statement form**.

Examples:

- He said, "Are you ready"?
 - → He asked if I was ready.
- She said, "Where is the key"?
 - → She asked where the key was.



Changing Imperative Sentences (Orders, Requests, Advice)

Rules:

- Use to + base verb
- Use not to for negative commands
- Use reporting verbs like told, ordered, requested, advised

Examples:

- Mother said, "Clean your room".
 - → Mother told me to clean my room.
- He said, "Don't shout".
 - → He told me not to shout.
- She said, "Please help me".
 - → She requested me to help her.

Teacher or EeeBee says 5 direct speech lines aloud. Students note them down and report them in indirect speech.










