## What is a Preposition?

A **Preposition** is a word that shows the relationship between a Noun or Pronoun and another word in the sentence.

## **Examples:**

- The cat is **under** the table.
- We sat near the lake.
- She ran towards the gate.



#### **Types of Prepositions:**

Туре	What It Shows	Examples
Time	When something happens on Monday, at 5pm, before lunch	
Place	Where something is	in the box, near the park
Direction	Where something is going towards school, into the room	
Manner	How something is done	with care, in a hurry

#### **Prepositional Phrases:**

A Prepositional Phrase starts with a preposition and ends with a Noun or Pronoun. It works like an Adjective or Adverb.

### **Examples:**

- The flowers in the vase are pretty.
- He arrived after the show.

#### **Common Errors to Avoid:**

• Incorrect: She sat on the chair in the sofa.

Correct: She sat on the chair near the sofa.

• Incorrect: I walked in the stairs.

Correct: I walked up the stairs.

## What is a Conjunction?

A Conjunction is a word that joins Words, Phrases, or Clauses Together.

Think of Conjunctions as bridges that help connect different parts of a sentence to make it smooth and meaningful.

## Why Are Conjunctions Important?

Without Conjunctions, we'd have to speak in short, choppy sentences. Conjunctions make our speech and writing flow better.

## **Example:**

• Without Conjunctions:

I have a pen. I have a pencil. I have an eraser.

• With Conjunctions:

I have a pen, a pencil, and an eraser.





## **Types of Conjunctions**

Туре	Function	Examples	
Coordinating	Joins equal parts	and, but, or, nor, for, so, yet	
Subordinating	Joins main and dependent clauses	because, although, if, while, since	
Correlative Pairs of joining words		eitheror, neithernor, not onlybut alsoroom	

#### **Compound and Complex Sentences**

- **Compound Sentence:** Two independent clauses joined by a coordinating conjunction **Example:** I wanted to go outside, but it was raining.
- Complex Sentence: An independent clause + dependent clause joined by a subordinating conjunction

**Example:** I stayed home because it was raining.





## **Linking Ideas with Conjunctions**

• Contrast: but, although, whereas

• Cause/Reason: because, since, as

• Condition: if, unless

• Choice: or, either...or

• Addition: and, not only...but also



#### **Examples:**


**Student A:** I saw a cat under the car.




