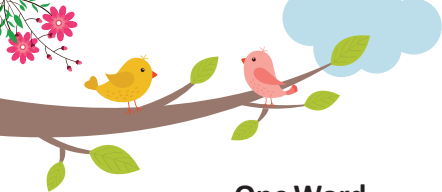
Learning Outcomes
